Positive

Contractée

I	am	I'm
You	are	You're
He		He
She	is	She's
It		It
We	are	We're
You	are	You're
They	are	They're

### Example:

*I am your English teacher.*

*I'm your classmate.*

*She is my friend.*

*She's a nice friend.*

*They are my parents.*

*They're at the party.*

*My name is Rebecca.*

*Dylan is 25 years old.*

*Eric is my brother.*

*Pets are cute.*

## TO BE SIMPLE PRESENT (toutes les formes)

Négative

Contractée

I	am not	I'm	not
You	are not	You	aren't
He, She, It	is not	He, She, It	isn't
We	are not	We	aren't
You	are not	You	aren't
They	are not	They	aren't

Example:

*I am not from Asia.*

*I'm not the owner.*

*She is not my cousin.*

*She isn't a good worker.*

*They are not my parents.*

*They aren't at the party.*

*My name is not Rebecca.*

*Dylan isn't 25 years old.*

*Eric is not your brother.*

*These pets aren't cute.*

## TO BE SIMPLE PRESENT (toutes les formes)

Interrogative	Interro-negative
Am I ?	Am I not?
Are you ?	Aren't you?
Is he she it ?	Isn't he she it ?
Are we ?	Aren't we?
Are you ?	Aren't you?
Are they ?	Aren't they?

### Example:

*Am I not the winner?*

*Isn't it hot today?*

*Is she your cousin?*

*Is this a pen or a pencil?*

*Are they sweet?*

*Aren't they ripe?*
