

TO HAVE OR HAVE GOT (British) SIMPLE PRESENT (toutes les formes)

Positive	Contractée
I have / have got	I've / got
You have / have got	You've / got
He	He
She has / has got	She 's got
It	It
We have / have got	We've / got
You have / have got	You've / got
They have / have got	They've / got

Example:

I **have** a new car.

I **have got** a new bike.

She **has** a beautiful house.

She **has got** a nice boat.

They've new classrooms.

They've got new computers.

Rebecca **has** a dog.

Dylan **has got** a cat.

TO HAVE OR HAVE GOT (British) SIMPLE PRESENT (toutes les formes)

Négative et Contractée

(I do not have / He does not have / I have not got)

I	don't have	I	haven't got
You	don't have	You	haven't got
He	doesn't have	He	hasn't got
She		She	
It		It	
We	don't have	We	haven't got
You	don't have	You	haven't got
They	don't have	They	haven't got

Example:

I **don't have** a car.

I **haven't got** a black car.

She **doesn't have** a book.

She **hasn't got** a new friend.

They **don't have** a good coach.

They **haven't got** medals.

Rebecca **doesn't have** a bear.

Dylan **hasn't got** a toy.

TO HAVE OR HAVE GOT (British) SIMPLE PRESENT

Interrogative

Have I got ?	Do I have ?
Have you got ?	Do you have ?
<div>He</div> <div>Has She got?</div> <div>It</div>	<div>He</div> <div>Does She Have?</div> <div>It</div>
Have we got ?	Do we have ?
Have you got ?	Do you have ?
Have they got ?	Do they have ?

Example:

*Have you **got** a new phone?*

*Does she **have** a red car?*

*Do I **have** a shower?*

*Has he **got** a camera?*

*Do your parents **have** a boat?*

*Have your parents **got** a car?*
